FUNDAMENTALS OF DENTAL ASSISTING STUDENT INFORMATION SHEET

Students are required to successfully complete one hundred (100) hours of classroom and skills lab instruction and nine hours of independent observation in a dental office (a **separate** dental office if currently employed by a dentist). This course meets the requirements of the Idaho Division of Career Technical Education and is a pre-requisite to the Dental Assisting EXPANDED FUNCTIONS courses.

FIRST DAY OF CLASS: Please be prompt as orientation to course is in the first hour. Testing, immunizations, CPR, and options for lab jacket will be discussed.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

ATTENDANCE: The state of Idaho requires all students attend 90% of the course to pass. Students need to make necessary arrangements to avoid conflicts with the course dates/times (work, other classes, etc.).

CPR: Prior to the end of the course, each student shall have current certification of American Heart Association (AHA) Basic Life Support (Healthcare Provider) CPR.

If a CPR card does not say AHA Basic Life Support (Healthcare Provider) CPR, the student must return to the CPR training center or instructor to get documented verification of 1) concepts taught; 2) student passing both a skills test and written test; 3) scores on testing. Heartsaver is NOT equal.
