COURSE REQUIREMENTS

ATTENDANCE: The state of Idaho requires all students attend 90% of the course to pass. Students need to make necessary arrangements to avoid conflicts with the course dates/times (work, other classes, etc.).

CPR: Prior to the end of the course, each student shall have current certification of American Heart Association (AHA) Healthcare Provider (HCP) CPR.

If a CPR card does not say AHA Healthcare Provider CPR, the student must return to the CPR training center to get documented verification of 1) concepts taught; 2) student passing both a skills test and written test and required competency.
