

## PHLEBOTOMY TECHNICIAN STUDENT INFORMATIONAL SHEET

Students are required to successfully complete one hundred and twenty (120) hrs of classroom and skills lab instruction and forty (40) hours of clinical in a health agency. This course is mandated by the Idaho Division of Professional Technical Education.

## **COURSE REQUIREMENTS**

<u>ATTENDANCE</u>: In alignment with state requirements, all students must attend 90% of the course to pass. <u>Students should assure schedule does not conflict with work schedules, school schedules or other.</u>

BACKGROUND CHECK: Due to the phlebotomy technician role of caring for vulnerable humans, agencies require both phlebotomy technicians and phlebotomy technician students to pass a fingerprint-based, state and national background check. The cost of the background check is included in course fees. Recent background checks for other organizations <u>cannot</u> be substituted. Passing or failing the background check is dependent on the type of crime(s) and/or when it occurred. Information of this nature is included on the Idaho Criminal History Unit website at <a href="https://www.chudhw.idaho.gov/">https://www.chudhw.idaho.gov/</a>. If a crime is on the list as a disqualifying offense, the student cannot enter clinical; therefore cannot pass the course.

<u>CLINICAL</u>: The course end date is <u>highly</u> subject to change. Each student must have 100 blood draws and 40 hours of clinical. If more time is necessary to obtain 100 blood draws, the course end date must be delayed. Clinical occurs throughout southeast ldaho and can be scheduled any time of day or night. At least one month advance notice will be provided. Students must provide own transportation and instructor cannot schedule two students at the same location.

<u>CPR</u>: Prior to clinical each student shall have and maintain current certification of American Heart Association (AHA) Healthcare Provider (HCP) CPR. Visit <a href="https://workforcetraining.isu.edu">https://workforcetraining.isu.edu</a> or call (208) 282-3372 for CPR dates. NOTE: If a CPR card does not say AHA Healthcare Provider CPR, the student must return to the CPR training center to get documented verification of 1) concepts taught; 2) student passing both a skills test and written test.

HEPATITIS B: Prior to clinical, each student shall provide proof of <u>one</u> of the following 1) at least the first dose of hepatitis B vaccine; 2) a positive titer indicating immunity to hepatitis B 3) documented refusal of the hepatitis B vaccine. Note: The three-shot series provides life-long immunity.

**NEGATIVE TB TEST:** Prior to clinical, each student shall provide proof of a negative TB test administered within one year of clinical start date. *Positive* TB tests: student must provide physicians note releasing student to care for vulnerable populations. Note: This is a skin test that takes three days from administration to evaluation.
