Parking Passes: Those participants that were members of FFL during the fall 2025 semester need to KEEP their current parking pass, a new one will not be issued. New participants will need and get a new parking pass, (pass will be issued by filling out a form cetrain.isu.edu/parking and emailing it in to ISU). After CEWT has received the filled out form the parking pass will be sent from ISU, this pass is to be used until August 2026. The cost of the parking pass is included in the registration.

You must have a parking pass displayed prominently anytime you park on the ISU campus, or you may be ticketed. Note: Replacement parking passes can be purchased from Kathie Hendrix (208-589-4352) at an additional cost of \$6.50.

Fall 2026 the Paw Print passes will not be available as the University will be going to all electronic scanning of vehicles in the parking lots.



Content: This Hiking, Walking, Exploring (HWE) "class" consists of various outdoor "shared adventures" (about two per month) from April or May through September or October (weather dependent). Activities may include hiking, biking, float trips, horseback riding, caving/climbing (non-technical), zip lining, bird watching, etc. This is a participatory class, guided by class (your) input and available facilitators/ coordinators, so we are open to try most anything. Activities can range from easy to strenuous and might last two hours or all day depending on the activity and/or selected location. Locations generally must be within 150 miles or 2.5 hours (driving time) of Idaho Falls. Class enrollees

will also be placed on the email distribution list for HWE's week-long trip announcements - generally, 3 or 4 trips per year (January - December).

"Shared adventures" refers to outdoor recreational experiences undertaken by two or more individuals who are working cooperatively toward a common goal, sharing in decision-making, other responsibilities, and costs as equitably as possible. While there is a designated Facilitator (i.e., coordinator or point of contact) for each activity, there is no "leader" in the sense of a single person who makes all the decisions and who owns all of the responsibility. Shared adventures are an excellent opportunity to get outdoors, embrace personal challenge, develop resilience and learn adaptability in a supportive group environment.

Content: Join us for an insightful presentation by Dr. Rob Kirk titled "Hydrology of the Upper Snake River Basin: How Climate, Geology, Management, and Water-Rights Administration Determine Streamflow." Dr. Kirk will guide us through the complex interactions that shape water availability in our region, explaining how natural forces and human decisions together influence the flow of the Upper Snake River. This program offers a valuable opportunity to deepen your understanding of the systems that sustain our communities, agriculture, and ecosystems. All are welcome to attend and learn from this engaging and timely discussion. This will be an interactive version that incorporates some small-group activities.
