FUNDAMENTALS OF DENTAL ASSISTING STUDENT INFORMATION SHEET

Students are required to successfully complete one hundred (100) hours of classroom and skills lab instruction and nine hours of independent observation in a dental office (a *separate* dental office if currently employed by a dentist). This course meets the requirements of the Idaho Division of Career Technical Education and is a pre-requisite to the Dental Assisting EXPANDED FUNCTIONS courses.
