Minnie Howard Award

The 2025 winner of the Minnie Howard Award was announced on October 8th at the 124th Chamber Annual Awards Dinner at the Shoshone Bannock Casino Hotel. Congratulations goes out to our own NKA member Sharon Manning who was nominated by another NKA member Mary Spinner.

The Minnie Howard Award is named for Dr. Minnie Howard who was an early (1902) Pocatello physician. She was a prominent local historian who helped locate the original site of Fort Hall and was one of the founding members of the Oregon Trail Association. Minnie Howard helped establish the Pocatello Public Library and

organized major regional art and history programs for our area. She was an active member of the Women's Christian Temperance Union and the Congregational Church and numerous other civic organizations. She and her husband had four sons, all of whom became physicians. Dr. Howard is listed as one of 20 significant women in Idaho's history by the Idaho Women's Commission.

Silver Stars Award



Class Absences

Please remember our instructors are volunteers with busy schedules who make time to prepare and share their knowledge and expertise with us, and in some cases spend their own money on materials/handouts for the class with respect to the number of students on the attendance roster. Please be considerate to both our instructors and facilitators and call ISU Continuing Education/Workforce Training (CEWT) at 208-282-2789 during business hours – Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. – as soon as you know you can't attend a class.

A timely call to ISU CEWT to cancel a class is especially important if you've signed up for a class with limited attendance. Not cancelling a limited attendance class, in most cases, prevents others on a waitlist from attending the class. A call to cancel a class notifies CEWT to fill the vacant spot with the next person on the waitlist and inform the facilitator of the change. Please note if ISU CEWT receives a cancellation after 4:00 p.m. on the day before the limited attendance class or on the day ²⁵ of the class, CEWT will not try to fill the class with someone on the waitlist. CEWT will notify the facilitator of the cancellation.
